

# **School Zone Safety**

Rosewood school buses will be driving around our community soon!

Watch for kids walking to and from our new schools and neighbouring schools, and kids getting on/off school buses and transit.



Police will be paying particular attention to motorists speeding in school zones, failing to stop at stop signs or yield signs, failing to yield for pedestrians, failing to obey crossing guards, or failing to obey school bus signs.

#### **SCHOOL ZONES**

- \* The maximum speed limit in schools zones is 30 kph.
- \* In effect Mondays to Fridays, 8:00 am 5:00 pm, September to June including statutory holidays.
- \* Are marked by reflective, fluorescent yellow-green signs.
- \* Starts at 30 kph speed sign and ends at the greater speed limit sign (normally 50 kph).
- \* Offenders receive a fine and three SGI demerit points.

#### DROP-OF AND PICK-UP ZONES

Designated drop-off and pick-up zones have been added to the new school roadway/parking area. Please make sure to follow the information on the posted signs to ensure you are complying with the rules.



#### **RESTRICTED U-TURNS IN SCHOOL ZONES**

The fine for violating this restriction is \$50.00 and enforcement is handled by the Saskatoon Police Service.



# Choosing a Kennel for Your Pet

There can be many hesitations when you are considering a kennel for your dog or cat. Will they be happy? Will they be supervised and taken care of? Most importantly, will they be safe?

Here are a few questions for prospective kennels and some considerations prior to boarding your pet.

#### 1. TOURING THE FACILITY

- \* Can you drop-in and view the entire facility prior to boarding, or do they hesitate to show you around when asked. If they do not allow drop-in tours, this is a red flag.
- \* Does the premise look wellmaintained?
- \* How clean are the kennels, outdoor areas, and staff areas? Is there a pungent or foul smell when you enter the facility? Are there cleaning products readily accessible? Are litter boxes clean? Are dogs let outside for urination/defecation or left in their kennels?
- \* Is the facility made of sanitizable material (stainless steel, sealed concrete without cracks, or properlysealed plastic kennels are best). Cracked un-sealed concrete and rubber cannot be sanitized. How often are kennels cleaned?

#### 2. SECURITY

- \* Do they have cameras, security guards, or a security system for afterhours?
- \* Do they have staff on the premises 24/7 or someone that checks in periodically?
- \* What is the outdoor fencing like? Could a dog or cat potentially escape the premise? Ask what safeguards are in place to prevent escapees.

# 3. VACCINATION/HEALTH STATUS OF BOARDING ANIMALS

- \* Does the kennel require proof of vaccinations (a veterinarian-signed document)? If a kennel does not require proof of vaccination, this is a red flag.
- \* Do they require pets to be spayed and neutered?
- \* Do they require ectoparasite treatment (ie flea/lice/tick preventive)?
- \* The more requirements they have decreases the risk of boarding an unhealthy animal. This leads to lower risk of disease transmission to your pet.

# 4. FEEDING/WATERING AND GENERAL COMFORT

- \* Is there a fresh source of water available 24/7? How often are bowls checked/re-filled? Are the bowls clean?
- \* Are they able to feed specialty diets or give medications if needed?

- \* Is there adequate lighting in the event of a power outage?
- \* What type of bedding do they provide and can it be washed/ sanitized properly?
- \* Are the kennels large enough for a sleeping area and feeding area? Is there enough room for a litterbox while still allowing room for a sleeping/feeding area?
- \* Is there proper ventilation in the facility? There should never be a strong smell of animal waste or chemical cleaning products. What temperature do they maintain the facility? It should never exceed 27 degrees Celsius indoors.
- Are cats and dogs housed separately?
   Cats should be in their own quiet area away from dog noise and activity.
- \* Cats like to hide and have a vantage point – is there somewhere for them to hide in the kennel or a place to perch?

#### 5. OUTDOOR AREAS

- Are outdoor enclosures clean and well-maintained? Enclosures should be 'escape' proof with double fencing maintained in good condition.
- \* Do they offer protection from wind, rain, and cold weather?
- \* Is there scheduled play/exercise time outside?

#### 6. STAFF TRAINING

 Is the staff trained in animal CPR? Is there an emergency evacuation plan

- in place?
- \* Are they trained in administering various medications if needed?
- Are there protocols in place to get your pet to a veterinarian if needed?
   Ask what their protocol is if there is an animal emergency.
- \* What is your first impression of the staff? Do they appear to genuinely care about your pet, appear knowledgeable, and appear responsible? Gut instincts should not be ignored.

#### 7. REFERENCES

- \* Will the facility offer to give you references (personal and professional)?
- \* Are they certified by a third-party such as the Better Business Bureau?
- \* Don't be afraid to ask the tough questions. If they are dodging your questions or refuse to answer, go elsewhere. Trust your intuition!

#### **Rosewood Elementary Schools**

#### **Rosewood Community Centre**

#### **Road Construction / Safety**

The speed display board on Rosewood Blvd is to make drivers aware of their speed and remind them to follow the speed limit. The City will review the data after the speed board has been removed late in 2017.

#### **Boychuk Drive / Highway 16 Interchange**

Significant changes have been made to the existing intersection with the redirection of traffic flow. Please watch for workers/work vehicles in this area, as well as other drivers that may be unsure of the detours. Speed limits in the construction zone vary, 40 kph and 60kph.

Rosewood residents will be kept up to date with notifications via the City's Road Restrictions and Construction Projects Map.

#### **Connecting Rosewood Residential Area to Zimmerman Road**

The residential area of Rosewood is currently not connected to Rosewood's Meadows Market commercial area. Work was anticipated to continue this year. Updates will be provided as received.

#### Flynn Manor / Olson Lane West

An active pedestrian corridor will be installed on the east side of Flynn Manor across Olson Lane West prior to the fall school year. With the opening of the schools in Rosewood please take extra care when driving in our community as there will be an increase in pedestrians.

#### **Commercial Construction**

#### **Rosewood Boulevard West**

Construction continues on the two commercial areas near the Boychuk Drive entrance. Leopold's Tavern opened August 4, 2017. The 7-Eleven Convenience Store and Anytime Fitness are set to open late August/ early September 2017.

#### The Rosewood Meadows Market

The Market is anticipated to include a mix of groceries and fresh produce to sporting goods, medical offices, restaurants, fashion stores, coffee houses and more. The next phase of the market is set to be opening in 2018. These are tentative dates and subject to change.

# **Rosewood Updates**

#### **Park Construction**

Park concept plans are subject to changes. Construction timing is tentative and also subject to change.

For updates on Rosewood park construction visit our website.

#### Glen H. Penner Park

Construction of the park began in June 2017 and the City is anticipating portions, including the installation of the playground will be in place for the start of the school year. The park is estimated to be completed in the summer 2018.

Park features will include; a softball and soccer field, toboggan hill, play area, spray park pad (estimated 2018) and future rink area (date TBD).

The Rosewood Community Association is in the planning stages for the rink. Fundraising and volunteers will be needed to help in the near future. So if you are interested in lending a hand, providing services or supplies please contact us by email.

#### **Mackay Park**

Park construction is underway and currently estimated for summer 2018 completion. Mackay Park has many access points, one end connects Swick Park and the other end Olson Lane near the schools.

#### **Struthers Park**

The design of Struthers Park is nearing completion. The City will be posting the tender for this park likely this fall. There is currently no set timeline for the construction of this park.

#### **Hyde Park Maintenance Yard**

The satellite maintenance facility along Slimmon Road in Hyde Park is nearly complete and staff are anticipated to be on-site this fall.

# **Interesting Facts**

#### WHAT'S IN A PARK NAME?

Here are the meanings behind the names for our Parks.

ADAMS PARK: Bob Adams was involved with track and field as an athlete, coach, official, and administrator at all levels from local to international. Athlete: 1952 Olympics and 1954 Commonwealth Games, Coach: 1958 Commonwealth Games and 1964 Olympics. Awards: City of Saskatoon's Merit & Jubilee: Confederation of Canada Centennial Medal; Kinsmen Sportsman of the Year; and Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame.

BITZ PARK: Edmund Bitz was a teacher, involved in sports and other organizations, coach and official for softball and hockey, and he wrote umpire manual.

HYDE (DISTRICT) PARK: The Hyde Park naturalized wetlands area has been preserved and is named for the Hyde Family. Hermine and Orville settled the area in 1930's farming and living on the



land in and surrounding Hyde Park. Elmer and Agnes took over the land from his parents. The Hyde family were environmentally friendly avoiding pesticides and herbicides in their farming operations.

**SWICK PARK:** Jules Swick sporting contributions and accomplishments include: Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame inductee as a Builder - 2001; 22 years as a Hockey official in Western Hockey League (WHL); Refereed Memorial and Allan Cup games; past president of Saskatchewan Golf Association.






# Fall Gardening & Lawn Care

#### **LAWN CARE**

Make sure you use fall fertilizer on your lawn to encourage roots and help green up your lawn earlier in the spring. Do one final mow low cut (but not too low) late in the summer .

#### **CLEANING UP LEAVES/MULCHING**

Bagging leaves is one option but also consider mowing them to break the leaves into small pieces and leave them on the lawn. They will decompose throughout the winter. Make sure to mow when they are dry and no more than about six inches of leaves per season. Excess can be used as mulch in your flowerbeds and vegetable garden, or add to your compost bin.



#### TREE AND SHRUB PLANTING

Contrary to what some may think, fall is a good time for planting right up until the end of September or early October depending on weather. Talk to your garden centre about what you can plant in the fall.

#### **FALL PRUNING**

Late fall is an excellent time to prune trees and shrubs when they become dormant. Talk to your garden centre about proper pruning techniques and timing for the type of plants you are looking to prune.



#### **FLOWER GARDEN**

Cut back your perennial flowers during the fall. A little bit of effort in the fall will provide healthier flower beds for your garden. If you are unsure how much or when to cut back, talk to your garden centre, and you can also check online. Not all flowers are the same so it's a good idea to check when doing it for the first time.

#### **FALL BULBS**

There are bulbs such as tulips that should be planted in the fall so they will be the first to bloom in the spring. Check with your favourite garden centre to see what bulbs you can plant.

There are some native plants that you might be interested in planting such as the prairie crocus. It's always a beautiful sight to see flowers bloom even when there's snow on the ground!

#### **OUTDOOR WATERING SYSTEM/FAUCETS**

Remove all garden hoses, drain and store in your garage or shed. Standing water can freeze irrigation system outdoor water spigots, Make sure to turn off and drain to avoid freezing & pipe breakage.

#### YARD EQUIPMENT CLEANING / MAINTENANCE

Clean lawn care equipment including draining and properly disposing fuel for gas operated equipment. Prep for winter by checking your snowblower and other winter equipment to make sure they are functioning. You may even want to clean the garage to get a jump on spring cleaning!


