

Street Sweeping

Why is my street so dirty? A big part of why the roads in Rosewood are often covered with dirt and debris is due to ongoing construction in our neighbourhood which will continue for a few more years.

Since Rosewood is a community under development it does not fall under the City's regular citywide neighbourhood street sweeping schedule. Last year the City of Saskatoon created a map of Rosewood showing the responsibility for roads/street sweeping in our area.



Dates for the City owned sections shown in blue have not been finalized. They have advised that street sweeping is estimated to take place the end of June or early July 2017 between the hours of 7:00 AM and


Please note that once sweeping dates are set they may still change due to rain. Delays in the residential schedule may occur as developing areas have more debris and may take longer to complete.

36 hours before scheduled sweeping, bright yellow 'No Parking' sandwich boards will be placed along roads to be swept.


Since the remaining sections in Rosewood are still the responsibility of the developers, they are not included in the above street sweeping schedule. The map shows who is responsible for which sections in Rosewood. Contact the Developer for more details about these areas.

Developers need to obtain a Final Acceptance Certificate (FAC) which is awarded 2 years after the work section has been deemed substantially complete by the City in order to fall under civic responsibility.

Once handed over to the City the Public Works Division regular road maintenance activities will begin to the current level of service.

Dogs and Off-Leash Dog Parks

HOW TO PROMOTE A SAFE AND FUN ENVIRONMENT

Off-leash dog parks are a great way to exercise your dog. They can be used for dogs to socialize and play in a fun environment. But the fun can get cut short by an incident between one or more dogs (and their humans). Even the most well-behaved, trained, and socialized dogs can get into a conflict if the circumstances are right.

The most important skill your dog should have prior to going to an offleash park is good recall. This skill is usually part of basic obedience and puppy classes. This is an important skill for your dog to have if they get into a dangerous situation, but also if he or she is approaching a more timid dog that needs space.

SOME IDEAS ON HOW TO AVOID **CONFLICT AT OFF-LEASH PARKS AND** SOME HEALTH TIPS TO KEEP YOUR DOG SAFE:


- * If your dog is still learning proper recall and socialization, consider going to the park with the leash on the first few times. Once you see how they interact with other dogs and recall improves, then try without a leash.
- * Try not to let your dog steal other dogs' toys. Also, if your dog loves to fetch but doesn't like to share his toy, try to do this in an area of the park where there aren't other dogs. Avoid throwing a toy at the moment another dog is approaching.
- * Avoid standing around and forming large groups at the entrances to the park. Many dogs become overwhelmed when 10 dogs run up to them at
- * If you notice your dog playing too roughly with another dog, especially

the smaller ones, please guide them to another area of the park and find dogs of equal size for play. Big dogs don't always know how strong they

- Know your dog. If he or she is overly anxious, fearful or showing signs of aggression, consider sticking to on-leash areas with controlled interactions until your dog becomes more comfortable around others. It is important to remember that not every dog will be a right fit for the offleash park and you are being a responsible pet owner by not taking them. Other activities you could enjoy with your dog instead include agility, flyball, barn-hunt, obedience trials, shutzhund, etc.
- If you find yourself and your dog in an unsafe or uncomfortable situation - Keep Your Cool. Yelling and screaming at your dog or other people around you is not going to help. Try to diffuse the situation by getting your dog's attention and removing them from the situation.
- One of THE most important things at the off-leash park is to PAY ATTENTION and NEVER leave your dog unattended. Be aware of where your dog is at all times and stay close. Great recall doesn't work if your dog can't hear you.
- Sudden Increases in temperature in the spring can lead to heat stroke. It takes your dog's body time to adjust to increases in temperature. Know the signs of heat stroke (heavy panting/breathing, sudden collapse, lethargy, shaking) and keep your dog well-hydrated. Give them breaks from high bursts of activity and allow them time to cool off in the shade.
- Lastly, please clean up your doggie's doo! No one likes to step on a big poo when walking around the park, and feces transmit disease and parasites.

So, with basic recall mastered and a good reward or distraction in hand (food or toy), now you can head to the park. Bring plenty of water for you and your dog and always pay attention. Have fun!



Rosewood Updates

Rosewood Elementary Schools

Only three months until the schools open in September 2017! An Open House is scheduled between 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM during Rosewood's Family Fun Day on Saturday, August 26, 2017.

Road Construction

Boychuk Drive / Highway 16 Interchange

Work is underway and we can expect delays until completion, currently set for July 31, 2019. Please make sure to slow to 60km speed limit in the construction zone and watch for workers and drive safely.

WORKERS

Detours and road closures are to be expected during this project and Rosewood residents will be kept up to date with notifications via the City's Road Restrictions and Construction Projects Map.

The interchange design includes pedestrian and cyclist pathways and there are plans for sound attenuation walls to minimize traffic noise however details have not been confirmed. More details to follow.

Rosewood Boulevard East / Zimmerman Road

The residential area of Rosewood is currently not connected to the Meadows Market commercial area. It is anticipated that work will continue on this road this year. More details to follow.

Parks

The City of Saskatoon posted three tenders on SaskTenders recently for park construction in Rosewood.

Glen H. Penner Park

The neighbourhood park landscape construction of Glen H. Penner is scheduled to begin in June 2017 and completed by August 17, 2017.

The conception, detailed design and installation of playground equipment is also scheduled to be completed by August 17, 2017.

Design components of the park include; softball and soccer field, toboggan hill, play area, water feature and future rink area.

Mackay Park

Landscape construction of Mackay Park is set to beginning this spring and is scheduled to be completed October 31, 2017.

Struthers Park

A detailed draft concept plan of Struthers Park is currently being prepared and is anticipated to be placed on SaskTenders in June 2017 with work beginning this summer.

Hyde Park Maintenance Yard

They have broken ground and construction is set to begin on the new satellite maintenance facility located along Slimmon. This facility will improve customer service, coordination of park maintenance, and storage for equipment necessary for maintenance services to new parks including those in Rosewood.



Commercial Construction

Rosewood Boulevard West

Construction continues on the two commercial areas near the Boychuk Drive entrance. Tim Horton's is set to open the 1st week of June 2017. Leopold's Tavern, Anytime Fitness and the 7-11 Store are confirmed on the south side and are set to open sometime in August/September 2017. No other businesses have been confirmed at this time.

The Rosewood Meadows Market

Ground servicing for the next phase of this commercial area located on the east side of Rosewood is set to begin anytime now. This phase will include a retail mix of "soft-good" stores (clothing, home furnishings, services & restaurants) and is currently set to begin opening in 2017. Interesting Facts

CANADA CELEBRATES ITS "SESQUICENTENNIAL" 150 YEARS!

From 1864 to 1867, representatives of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and the Province of Canada (Upper and Lower Canada), with British support, worked together to establish a new country. These men are known as the Fathers of Confederation. They created two levels of government: federal and provincial.

The old Province of Canada was split into two new provinces: Ontario and Quebec, which, together with New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, formed the new country called the Dominion of Canada. Each province would elect its own legislature and have control of such areas as education and health.

The British Parliament passed the British North America Act in 1867. The Dominion of Canada was officially born on July 1, 1867. Until 1982 July 1 was celebrated as "Dominion Day" to commemorate the day that Canada became a self-governing Dominion. Today it is officially known as Canada Day.

1870 - Manitoba, Northwest Territories (NWT) 1871 - British Columbia

1873 - Prince Edward Island 1880 - Transfer of Arctic Islands (to NWT)

1898 - Yukon Territory 1905 - Alberta, Saskatchewan

1949 - Newfoundland and Labrador 1999 - Nunavut

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Ever wondered if there is meaning to the names chosen for streets in Rosewood? Well there is.

PRITCHARD CRESCENT, LANE & TERRACE: John Pritchard - A Métis gentleman who helped save the lives of Theresa Delaney and Theresa Gowanlock, who personally called him a Hero in the book "Two Months in the Camp of Big Bear". John Pritchard's heroics were also

noted in the book "Blood Red".

ROCHELLE BAY: Rocky Rochelle GM Prairieland Exhibition Park - 1984; Very active in sports; served on many boards.

ROSEWOOD DRIVE, BOULEVARD, GATE, SQUARE: Named for the Rosewood neighbourhood.




Healthy Summertime Snacks

WATERMELON BLUEBERRY YOGURT POPS

Stay cool and refreshed this summer with these easy-to-make, creamy yogurt pops. The hardest part is waiting for them to freeze!



- * 500 mL (2 cups) 0% fat plain Greek yogurt
- 375 mL (1 1/2 cups) chopped seedless watermelon
- * 250 mL (1 cup) fresh blueberries
- * 75 mL (1/3 cup) liquid honey

Prep Time: 5 minutes / Makes 8 pops.

Place the yogurt, watermelon, blueberries and honey into a blender and puree until smooth. (For a chunkier texture, pulse the mixture until desired texture.)

Fill eight 125 mL (4 oz) popsicle molds or paper cups with yogurt mixture. If using paper cups, cover top with foil and poke a wooden craft stick through the centre of each pop.

Place molds on a flat surface in the freezer for at least 6 hours or up to 2

Tips:

- * Little chefs can help pour the yogurt mixture into the molds or paper
- The pops are hydrating and also packed with protein thanks to the Greek vogurt.
- Discover your favourite yogurt pop combo.
- Try these fruits: strawberries, raspberries, cantaloupe, honeydew melon, peaches or nectarines.


