



Street Sweeping

Lets get sweeping to clean our streets!

With all of the construction happening in Rosewood this is a major reason why many of our streets are covered with dirt and debris. We will continue to see a greater amount of debris on the roads until construction is complete.



Depending on where you like your street may not be swept by the City's street sweeping program. As much of Rosewood is still under development not all roads fall under the City of Saskatoon's regular sweeping schedule.

Help keep our community cleaner by sweeping debris off roads and sidewalks!

- * Rosewood streets being swept are shown in yellow on the map.
- * Scheduled for June 21, 2019 between 7:00 AM and 3:00 PM.
- * Sweeping date may change due to rain or be delayed as developing areas have more debris and may take longer to complete.
- * Move your vehicle before 7:00 AM to avoid a ticket and/or being relocated to a nearby street.
- * The City is scheduling sweeping in phases so you can park on neighbouring roads that don't have the signs up. If you forget to move your vehicle check the City's <u>Find My Vehicle</u>.

- * 36 hours before scheduled sweeping date bright yellow 'No Parking' sandwich boards will be placed along roads to be swept.
- Watch for slow moving sweeping equipment on the road, slow down, stay alert and remember that the operator will be focused on sweeping and may not see you
- * Non City scheduled roads are the responsibility of the developer. Contact them for information.



Park Etiquette

Did you know that there are rules a and regulations for using parks? The City of Saskatoon has over 200 parks and the City has created a map that allows you to search parks by name or location Parks Google MyMaps.

Here are some things to keep in mind while enjoying City parks this summer and throughout the year.

- * Parks are open between 5:00 AM to 12:00 AM (Midnight)
- * You must follow the rules posted within the parks
- * Help keep our parks clean! Toss your garbage into the garbage bins
- * Dogs must be leashed unless in an off leash dog park.
- * Don't let your dog chase wildlife and remember to scoop the poop!
- * Stay on the right side of pathways, and pass on the left side
- * Pedestrians have the right of way on paths
- * If cycling, use a warning bell and travel at a safe speed
- * If parking lots are full be considerate when parking on residential streets and do not park on the grass or block driveways
- * Stay off crusher dust (unpaved) paths after heavy rain falls to allow them to dry out o avoid extra maintenance
- * Refrain form using wet and soft fields as it will cause damage
- * No smoking is permitted Smoking Control ByLaw No. 8286
- * Provide parks maintenance staff with room to safely perform mowing and park maintenance tasks and to avoid iniuries

Rosewood Updates

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Taylor Street Primary Water Main Construction/Road

Construction fencing and signage remains up due to the installation of a primary water main at the end of Taylor Street just past Rosewood Gate North. This spring work resumed on the water main installation which was originally schedule for completion by October 31, 2018.

We are all anxiously awaiting to find out when the road construction portion will begin connecting to the Meadows Market commercial area of Rosewood. Stay tuned for more details!

Boychuk Drive / Highway 16 Interchange

The end is in sight! The final stages of construction continues and is on track for completion in July 2019. One small section still has a reduced speed limit of 60 km/h. Stay alert and watch for workers and construction vehicles & signage as they complete the remaining work.

PARK CONSTRUCTION

Once Rosewood has been fully built our there will be numerous parks and green corridors in our community. A reminder that parks are not to be accessed during the construction phase as there may be unseen dangers. Signs and fencing may remain in place after it looks like parks are completed. These are in place to provide newly planted vegetation an opportunity to become somewhat established before the park is open to the public. Once the fences are down it will still take a few years for vegetation to become established.

Park concept plans are subject to changes, construction timing is tentative and subject to change. For more updates on Rosewood park construction visit our website.

Glen H. Penner Park

A few areas still have fencing in place which should hopefully be removed soon. Fencing will remain in place around the spray pad due to delays with the spray pad installation project construction. Additional construction and landscaping around the spray pad is underway and is anticipated to be completed by July 31, 2019. The City has advised that the spray pad will ready for all to enjoy after it is completed. If all goes as planned there will still be time to enjoy it before fall arrives!

Rosewood Outdoor Rink Project



Dogs and Off-Leash Dog Parks

HOW TO PROMOTE A SAFE AND FUN ENVIRONMENT

Off-leash dog parks are a great way to exercise your dog. They can be used for dogs to socialize and play in a fun environment. But the fun can get cut short by an incident between one or more dogs (and their humans). Even the most well-behaved, trained, and socialized dogs can get into a conflict if the circumstances are right.



The most important skill your dog should have prior to going to an off-leash park is good recall. This skill is usually part of basic obedience and puppy classes. This is an important skill for your dog to have if they get into a dangerous situation, but also if he or she is approaching a more timid dog that needs space.

SOME IDEAS ON HOW TO AVOID CONFLICT AT OFF-LEASH PARKS AND SOME HEALTH TIPS TO KEEP YOUR DOG SAFE:

- * If your dog is still learning proper recall and socialization, consider going to the park with the leash on the first few times. Once you see how they interact with other dogs and recall improves, then try without a leash.
- * Try not to let your dog steal other dogs' toys. Also, if your dog loves to fetch but doesn't like to share his toy, try to do this in an area of the park where there aren't other dogs. Avoid throwing a toy at the moment another dog is approaching.
- * Avoid standing around and forming large groups at the entrances to the park. Many dogs become overwhelmed when 10 dogs run up to them at once.
- * If you notice your dog playing too roughly with another dog, especially the smaller ones, please guide them to another area of the park and find

- dogs of equal size for play. Big dogs don't always know how strong they can be!
- * Know your dog. If he or she is overly anxious, fearful or showing signs of aggression, consider sticking to on-leash areas with controlled interactions until your dog becomes more comfortable around others. It is important to remember that not every dog will be a right fit for the offleash park and you are being a responsible pet owner by not taking them. Other activities you could enjoy with your dog instead include agility, flyball, barn-hunt, obedience trials, shutzhund, etc.
- If you find yourself and your dog in an unsafe or uncomfortable situation
 Keep Your Cool. Yelling and screaming at your dog or other people around you is not going to help. Try to diffuse the situation by getting your dog's attention and removing them from the situation.
- * One of *THE* most important things at the off-leash park is to *PAY ATTENTION* and *NEVER* leave your dog unattended. Be aware of where your dog is at all times and stay close. Great recall doesn't work if your dog can't hear you.
- * Sudden Increases in temperature in the spring can lead to heat stroke. It takes your dog's body time to adjust to increases in temperature. Know the signs of heat stroke (heavy panting/breathing, sudden collapse, lethargy, shaking) and keep your dog well-hydrated. Give them breaks from high bursts of activity and allow them time to cool off in the shade.
- Lastly, please clean up your doggie's doo! No one likes to step on a big poo when walking around the park, and feces transmit disease and parasites.

So, with basic recall mastered and a good reward or distraction in hand (food or toy), now you can head to the park. Bring plenty of water for you and your dog and always pay attention. Have fun!

Call or Click Before You Dig

Landscaping around your property this summer? Contact Sask 1st Call, they will notify subscribing companies to come out and clearly mark underground facilities before you begin digging.



- Plan and mark where you will be digging by using small wooden stakes with survey tape, spray paint or white flags.
- Request a free line locate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and must be submitted a minimum of two (2) days ahead of your start date.
 You need to provide the street address, closest intersection, city, type of work being done and start date.
- * Once the lines are marked, they are valid for 10 working days.

 After that time you should contact them for another line locate.
- * Note Privately installed services may not be identified by 1st Call subscribers.



Interesting Facts About Saskatchewan...

- 1. Estevan is Canada's sunshine capital averaging 2,540 sunshinefilled hours each year.
- 2. Regina is home of Canada's only training academy for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) recruits.



- 3. Grasslands National Park preserves some of the last untouched prairie left in North America.
- 4. Eastend features the T.rex skeleton excavated in 1994/95, one of the best of only 12 such discoveries in the world. 'Scotty' makes her home at the T. rex Discovery Centre not far from where she was found.



- 5. Cypress Hills is the highest point between Labrador and the Rocky Mountains.
- 6. On the shore of Ajawaan Lake in Prince Albert National Park is the cabin and last home of Grey Owl - the world's most celebrated naturalist of the 1930s - still stands and is open to visitors.



- 7. Wanuskewin Heritage Park interprets 6,000 years of Northern Plains Indigenous culture.
- 8. The Athabasca Sand Dunes are among the most northerly major sand dunes in the world, and among the largest in North America.



9. Last Mountain Lake is the site of North America's oldest bird sanctuary (1887)

10. Historic Stanley Mission was established in 1850, and Holy Trinity Anglican Church that stands there is the oldest building in Saskatchewan.



- 11. Saskatchewan has an abundance of mineral wealth and is the world's chief source of uranium and potash. It also has one of the world's largest kimberlite fields.
- 12. Agriculture is big business in Saskatchewan. Almost half of Canada's total cultivated farmland is in Saskatchewan and we export globally 65% of the world's lentils, 54% of the world's peas, 34% of the world's durum
- 13. Saskatchewan is located in the heart of North America bordering Montana and North Dakota to the south, Manitoba to the east, Alberta to the west and the North West Territories to the north.
- 14. Saskatchewan is twice the size of Germany and approximately the same size as Texas. Half the province is covered by forest, one-third is farmland and one-eighth is fresh water.



Fire and Safety

OUTDOOR FIRE PITS

It's been just over a year since City Council made amendments to City Bylaws regarding outdoor fire pits which included new permitted hours for outdoor fire pits limiting it to between 2:00 pm and 11:00 pm.



WHEN ARE OUTDOOR FIRES NOT PERMITTED?

- * Outside the hours of 2:00 11:00 pm (open-air fire pits).
- * When weather conditions are conducive to creating a running fire or allowing the smoke from the fire to be a nuisance to another person (smoke drift).
- * If smoke from an outdoor fire becomes a nuisance or interferes with the use and enjoyment of another person's property, the fire is to be extinguished immediately.

WHAT SHOULD I USE AS AN OPEN-AIR FIRE PIT?

- * Fires must be contained within a non-combustible fire box constructed of cement, brick or metal of at least 18 gauge.
- * Use protective mesh spark screen cover.
- * Box must not exceed 0.61 metres.

WHAT IS NOT SUBJECTED TO THE BYLAW NO. 9484, 2018 AMENDMENT?

* BBQ Grills, smokers and outdoor pizza ovens used for food preparation, Chimeneas and permanent upright fireplaces, built in accordance with the National Building Code of Canada.

WHERE SHOULD I PUT MY OUTDOOR FIRE PIT?

* At least three (3) metres from any combustible materials such as buildings, fences, decks and trees. This is measured from the closest part of the object including any overhanding branches, etc.

WHAT AM I ALLOWED TO BURN?

* Only dry, cut seasoned cord wood or charcoal briquettes.

WHAT AM I NOT ALLOWED TO BURN IN MY BACKYARD IN THE CITY?

Rubbish, garden/yard waste, plastic, manure, livestock or animal carcasses, and any material that produces dense, black smoke including insulation, electrical wiring or equipment, asphalt roofing materials, hydrocarbons, rubber materials, painted or creosote treated wood.

CAN I LEAVE A FIRE PIT BURNING UNATTENDED?

- Fires are not to be left unattended at any time and require responsible supervision at all times.
- Always have a source of water nearby to extinguish fires once you are
- Do not leave a fire to burn out on its own unsupervised.

BARBECUES

A reminder to keep your barbecue unit a safe distance

from all combustible materials when lit and to never leave a lit barbecue unattended. Remember to check your barbecue regularly to ensure it is in good operating condition and never use a barbecue indoors.

FIREWORKS

Fireworks are permitted on private property only: from dusk to 11:00 p.m. on Victoria Day, Canada Day and Labour Day.

- * Adult supervision is required if under 18 years old.
- Choose a wide, clear site away from overhead obstacles.
- Do not fire in windy conditions.
- Read all instructions provided with the fireworks and plan the order of firing before you begin.















