Rosewood Updates

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Roadway Connections to Meadows Market in Rosewood

The City of Saskatoon is working with developers and the latest news is that at least one of the roadways on the Rosewood community plan may be open within the year to connect Rosewood with the Meadows Market commercial area on the east side of Rosewood.

Taylor Street Primary Water Main Construction/Road

Construction continues at the east end of Taylor Street just past Rosewood Gate North. This work now incorporates the building of the Taylor Street road extension. The City of Saskatoon has advised that this project is set to be completed in 2020.

PARK CONSTRUCTION

Once Rosewood has been fully built out there will be numerous parks and green corridors in our community.

Hyde Park (Phase II)

This fall the City of Saskatoon completed Stage 2 and part of Stage 3 enhancements to the park:

- * Placed a formal crusher dust pathway in the Southwest corner of the park to connect with existing pathways in Hyde Park.
- * Placed a formal crusher dust pathways at the North and South gates of the Dog Park to connect with existing pathways in Hyde Park.
- * Added more rip-rap (small-to-medium rocks) to the Dog Park area.
- * Installed outdoor sculptures within the park.
- * Enhanced naturalized plantings throughout the park (ongoing).
- * Developing interpretive and education areas to explain the significance of the naturalized park (2019/2020).
- * Stage 4: Naturalized Plantings (Over a few years).

Our team continues efforts fundraising for the rink project and working towards tentative construction on a rink base in 2020 pending City



Winter Holiday Recipes


SHORTBREAD COOKIES

It's that time of year to make some holiday cookies that are simple and so much fun for the whole family to mix, shape, bake, and decorate!





Соок: 15-20 мін



INGREDIENTS:

- ~ 1/2 cup corn starch
- ~ 1/2 cup icing sugar
- ~ 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ~ 3/4 cup softened butter

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Sift together cornstarch, powdered icing sugar, white sugar and flour
- 2. Blend in butter until it becomes a soft smooth dough ball
- 3. Roll out dough to desired thickness
- 4. Now for some fun!.... Using cookie cutters make different shaped cookies. You can add food colouring to make different coloured cookies, add sprinkles, or just leave the decorating until later.



- 5. Bake at 300°F for 15-20 minutes or until they are lightly browned.
- 6. After taking them out of the oven let them sit for a few minutes and then gently transfer the cookies to a cooling rack.
- 7. Once cooled completely you can decorate them with icing, sprinkles, chocolates, candies, whatever your favourite toppings are!

SLOW COOKER HOT CHOCOLATE

Are you having a crowd over and looking for something to warm everyone up? Try this amazing slow cooker hot chocolate recipe to warm you up! You can even add your favorite liqueur to each cup.



PREP TIME: 5 MIN



COOK TIME: 2.5 HR



INGREDIENTS:

- 300ml double cream
- 200g dark chocolate, chopped
- 100g milk chocolate, chopped
- scorched marshmallows, to serve
- softly whipped cream, to serve
- grated chocolate, to serve

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Pour the milk and double cream into the slow cooker. Add the dark chocolate and milk chocolate, then cover and cook on low for 2 hrs, stirring halfway through cooking.
- 2. Remove the lid and stir again, then continue to cook for a



LEMON SQUARES

Tangy, rich and oh so delicious! You won't be able to stop at just one.

PREP: 15 MIN

APPROX. 34 SQUARES

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup All-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 tsp grated lemon peel
- ~ 2 tbsp lemon juice
- ~ 1/2 tsp baking powder
- ~ 1/4 tsp salt
- 2 eggs

DIRECTIONS:

1. Blend flour, softened butter or margarine and powdered sugar together. Press into ungreased 9x9 inch pan and 1/2



- 2. Bake the crust at 350°F for 20 minutes.
- 3. Beat together granulated sugar, lemon peel, lemon juice, baking powder, salt and eggs with a mixer on high for 3 minutes or until it is light and fluffy. Then pour the mixture over the hot crust.
- 4. Place back in the oven for 25-30 minutes or until there is no indentation when lightly touching the centre.
- 5. Once cooled, dust with powdered sugar, cut into squares and enjoy!

MIMOSA

Enjoy a refreshing traditional drink this holiday season by mixing equal parts of chilled orange juice (or other citrus juice) and either alcoholic or non-alcoholic champagne (or other sparkling wine) into a champagne glass and enjoy!



Pet Tips - Holiday Safety

DECORATING

- * Christmas Trees ensure your tree is securely anchored so it does not tip over and fall. If you have a live tree, make sure your pet does not drink the tree water, as often it contains fertilizers or other chemical treatments. Make sure that ornaments are not accessible to pets and that your pets can't chew on any electrical cords.
- * Avoid using tinsel to decorate and be very careful with ribbon. Cats * love to play with tinsel and ribbons, but it can be swallowed and cause life-threatening intestinal obstruction that can require major surgery.
- * If you have simmering potpourri, ensure that it is kept in a location that is not accessible to your pets. When ingested, it can cause irritation to the mouth, stomach upset, and depression.
- * Toxic holiday plants Mistletoe, Holly, Christmas Cactus, Poinsettia, and many species of lilies are poisonous to pets. It is best to avoid having these plants around your house and consider having artificial plants instead.
- Diet The best treat you can give your pet is to keep them on their regular diet throughout the holidays. Avoid giving them high fat table food that can cause stomach upset, and don't give your pet bones. Turkey and chicken bones can splinter and cause intestinal blockages and perforations.
- Chocolate can be extremely toxic to pets so make sure it is kept in a pet-proof location, and not under the Christmas tree.
- * Safe toys just like the rest of the year, make sure you choose safe toys that your pet can't ingest, and check their toys regularly and replace those that show signs of destruction.

Pet Tips - Winter Safety

KEEP PETS INDOORS WITH YOU DURING THE WINTER MONTHS

- * If they must be housed outside, ensure they have an insulated shelter and a heated water bowl. Snow is not an adequate water source.
- Protect your dog's paws from cold and salt by using booties or applying paw protectors, such as Vaseline. Keep fur between pads trimmed and keep feet dry.
- Short-coated breeds may require coats or sweaters to stay warm when outside.
- Keep your pet away from toxins such as anti-freeze (ethylene glycol).
- * Anti-freeze is deadly to pets if ingested even in small amounts.
- Before starting your vehicle, tap on the hood or honk the horn. Outdoor cats may seek warmth by crawling under the hood - this can result in tragedy when the engine is started.

Winter Home Safety

Are you ready for winter? With the frigid cold, windy, and snowy winter weather in Saskatchewan, it is important to be prepared in case of emergencies.



POWER OUTAGES

Loosing power in winter is not only inconvenient due to these extremes it can be dangerous. If you don't already have an emergency kit you should consider making one. The kit should include: flashlight, candles and matches, battery-operated radio, extra batteries, corded landline phone, warm clothes, blankets, first aid kit, 72 hours worth of water, nonperishable and ready-to-eat foods.

CHRISTMAS TREE / LIGHTS FIRE SAFETY

Did you know that the most common cause of holiday fires are linked to faulty lights and dry Christmas trees?

Christmas Trees - If you are setting up a live tree pick one with green needles that don't fall off when touched. Once

home, cut two or more inches off the base, place in the stand and fill with hot water which will help the tree stay fresh longer. Then water normally at least daily. Never let it go dry! Place trees at least three feet from heat sources such as; fireplaces, candles and heating vents.

Christmas Lights - Should be CSA (Canadian Standards Association) approved, check to make sure they are not damaged before using, and never leave lights on when not home or going to sleep. Remember artificial trees are also susceptible to fires so don't forget to check the lights on prelit trees before using them as well.


Disposing Trees - Take down live trees before they become a fire hazard. After the holidays you can drop it off at the Wildwood Golf Course parking lot between Dec 26 - Jan 31 to be chipped for compost/mulch. If you miss

these dates you can keep in in your yard and drop it off at a compost depot in mid-April. Have an artificial tree? Help keep it out of the landfill by selling or donating used trees so another family can enjoy it!

Smoke Detectors - Check your smoke alarms and test them monthly. Your family should know what to do when a smoke alarm sounds. Have a plan and rehearse it. Planning ahead can save lives!














Holiday History Facts

CHRISTMAS CARDS

The first Christmas cards were commissioned by Sir Henry Cole and illustrated by John Callcott Horsley in London on May 1, 1843.



The image showed three generations of a family in the centre raising a toast to the card's recipient with scenes on each side showing charity, with food and clothing being given to the poor.

In the 1840's the "Official" Christmas cards began with Queen Victoria. The British royal family's cards are generally portraits reflecting significant personal events of the year.

CHRISTMAS TREES

The modern Christmas tree was developed in Germany and was traditionally decorated with roses made of coloured paper, apples, wafers, tinsel, and sweetmeats. In the 18th century, candles were placed in trees which were ultimately replaced by Christmas



lights due the invention of electricity. Today, decorations consist of items such as garland, tinsel, glass, wooden, fabric and plastic ornaments. The topper is traditionally an angel or star, however there are many other toppers available now. Edible items such as candy cane, gingerbread, chocolate and other sweets are also popular, and are tied to or hung from the tree's branches with ribbons.

The tradition of a Christmas tree was introduced to Canada in the winter of 1781 by Brunswick soldiers from Germany stationed in the Province of Quebec to garrison the colony against American attack.

General Friedrich Adolf Riedesel and his wife, the Baroness von Riedesel, held a Christmas party at Sorel, delighting their guests with a fir tree decorated with candles and fruits.

It is believed that the first known Christmas hymns may be traced to 4th century Rome. In the 12th century a Parisian monk began to derive music from popular songs, introducing something closer to the traditional Christmas carol. The publication of Christmas music books in the 19th century helped to widen the popular appeal of carols. Many of the traditional carols are still sung today.




